44 The Mitropoulou family planted assyrtiko in a valley in Central Macedonia more than a decade ago and winemaker Evanthia Mitropoulou finds that it thrives in the rich loam soils; she credits the limestone that lies underneath for giving the wine its mineral flavors. Farmed organically, the vines produced a small, concentrated crop in 2019, which she vinified in stainless steel, with minimal sulfur. The result is zesty and invigorating, with bright acidity and a salinity that keeps the pear flavors compellingly juicy. Those flavors broaden with time in the glass, developing a subtle richness that makes this very easy to drink. ** (8/2020)

K&L Notes

On the border of Macedonia and Thrace in northern Greece vigneron Nerantzi Mitropoulos has made it his life's mission to explore and express the indigenous varieties of his home country. Working organically and with all indigenous yeasts, each wine is a pure expression of its variety and the region. Assyrtiko, wellestablished as a grape by the island of Santorini, has the potential to expand outside the region. Nerantzi has planted it on primarily calcareous sandy-loam which has given it this beautiful texture and weight. The vineyards at nearly 1000 feet, are an ideal alternative to the volcanic pomice and ash that make up Santorini. We think you'll agree, this wine goes beyond potential and shows that Assyrtiko is Greece's most intriguing white

66 The cooperative of Borja and also the Borsao brand was founded in 1958. Some years later, the cooperatives of Pozuelo and Tabuenca joined to establish a new company called Bodegas Borsao S A. They are one of the main producers of Garnacha in the world. Single varietal of Garnacha. Vineyards of up to 850 m elevation from Tabuenca on red clay and sandstone, 450 m in Borja on gravel and 350 m in Pozuelo on limestone soils. Cryomaceration of one to two days, alcoholic fermentation in stainless-steel tanks for 10-12 days. Matured for five months in wood. Production of 150,000 bottles. Tasted blind, Dark fruit, concentrated blue wild berries and sweet toasted oak. Quite impressive ripeness and intensity. It has lots of extract and intensity, with big, dark-fruit impact, juicy and well ripened tannins. It is long and concentrated, substantial and exuberant. The oak charge is palatable but the wine has enough concentration to cope with it. Very young and hedonistic wine, on the modern side. 17.5/20 points. (FC) ** (6/2018)
